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TEXT

At the age of thirty-six, Agatha Christie must have been an enviable figure. She lived with her husband, Colonel Archibald Christie, in a magnificent country house and she was already the author of seven detective novels.

Then on the freezing cold night of 3rd December, 1926, she left her home on Sunning dale, Berkshire, and disappeared. At eleven the next morning, an officer at Guildford police station was handed a report saying that Agatha Christie's car had been found in halfway down a grassy bank with its bonnet buried in some bushes. At first the police suspected suicide. What few people would have known was that Agatha Christie's life couldn't have been very happy at the time. She had been sleeping badly, eating irregularly, and moving furniture around the house for no apparent reason.

Her husband couldn't have murdered her because he had been at a party all weekend in Surrey; he had a perfect alibi. Other journalists suspected she might disappeared in order to get publicity in the press. Then her brother-in-law Campbell received a letter from her whose postmark indicated that it had been posted in London at 9.45 am on the day after disappearance. Colonel Christie took an afternoon train, from London to Harrogate and learned that his wife had been staying in the hotel for a week and a half. She sang, danced, played billiards, read the newspaper reports of her own disappearance, chatted with her fellow guests and went for walks. Then she was spotted in Harrogate, Yorkshire.

The consequences of the whole story were not all unpleasant. Agatha Christie's next novel. The Big Four, was received badly by reviewers, but sold nine thousand copies. Till her death in 1976 Agatha Christie refused to discuss the mystery of her own disappearance
