

Classification

..... - the primary subdivision of a taxonomic kingdom, grouping together all classes of organisms that have the same body plan.

..... - a taxonomic category of the highest rank, grouping together all forms of life having certain fundamental characteristics in common.

..... - any of the taxonomic groups into which a phylum is divided and which contains one or more orders. *Amphibia*, *Reptilia*, and *Mammalia* are three classes of phylum *Chordata*

..... - any of the taxonomic groups into which a class is divided and which contains one or more families.

..... - any of the taxonomic groups into which an order is divided and which contains one or more genera.

..... - the usual major subdivision of a family or subfamily in the classification of organisms, usually consisting of more than one species.

..... - the major subdivision of a genus or subgenus, regarded as the basic category of biological classification, composed of related individuals that resemble one another, are able to breed among themselves, but are not able to breed with members of another species.
